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## INTRODUCTION

This **Student Policy Handbook** is effective January 2026 and remains effective until such time as it is replaced by a revised version of the **Hebrew Roots University Student Policy Handbook**.

As a prospective student or enrolled student, you are encouraged to review this **Student Policy Handbook** to understand the agreements made between you and the University.

**Hebrew Roots University** is an accredited educational institution of higher learning grounded on the rock of the Bible.

Inspired by YeHoVaH, the concept of **Hebrew Roots University** was given in 2014 and legally formed in 2018 by Dr. Arthur Bailey, President and Apostle/Overseer of **House of Israel International** and **Arthur Bailey Ministries International**, headquartered in Charlotte, North Carolina.

**Hebrew Roots University** acquired its Non-Governmental Accreditation status in December 2019, launched the **Hebrew Roots University** website in March of 2020, and conducted its first classes in May of 2020.

The Chancellor of **Hebrew Roots University** is Dr. Arthur Bailey. **Hebrew Roots University** is the higher learning, educational arm of **Arthur Bailey Ministries International**.

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## ADMISSION AND TRANSFER POLICIES

### General Admission Policy

Applicants are responsible for submitting a complete application package, including the application form available online at [www.hebrewrootsuniversity.com](http://www.hebrewrootsuniversity.com) and listing all prior institutions attended. All students are required to have official transcripts on file to receive a proper evaluation of transfer credits and a decision on admission to **Hebrew Roots University**. Students with a transcript hold at prior institutions are responsible to clear the holds to ensure that official transcripts are released timely and submitted to **Hebrew Roots University** for proper evaluation.

Following submission and acceptance of the student's application, a student may be fully admitted, conditionally admitted, or provisionally admitted to **Hebrew Roots University**.

- *Full Admission* - Students will be fully admitted without conditions following receipt of all official transcripts/documents required for admission and upon meeting all other requirements for admission.
- *Conditional Admission* - Students who do not meet the requirements for admission may be admitted to **Hebrew Roots University** with conditions following receipt of all official transcripts/documents required for admission and upon approval of an admission appeal to the **Office of Academic Affairs**.
- *Conditional Admission for Doctoral Students*: Doctoral students who do not meet minimum admission requirements with respect to grade point average, an earned Master's degree in a related discipline, or professional experience may be conditionally admitted by the Chancellor. Doctoral students admitted conditionally must meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements during the first two sessions of enrollment. Conditionally admitted doctoral students who meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements will be granted full admission to the program. Students who do not meet Satisfactory Academic Progress requirements will no longer be eligible for enrollment. Students no longer eligible for enrollment may submit an appeal to the **Office of Academic Affairs**.
- *Provisional Admission* - Students may be provisionally admitted to **Hebrew Roots University** before the receipt of all official documents required for admission.

Deadlines for the submission of all required documents are as follows.

- 8-week sessions: 3 weeks from the Term start date
- 16-week sessions: 3 weeks from the Term start date



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## **Admission Requirements**

Students must have a 2.0 Grade Point Average (GPA) from their most recent educational institution to be considered for admission to **Hebrew Roots University**.

Subject to additional college or program-specific admission requirements, the following Standard Admission Requirements apply:

- Complete an Application Form and submit a \$50.00 Application Fee.
- Submit an Official Transcript from your High School or College/University. If you attended a College/University, the High School Transcript is waived. The official transcript must arrive in a sealed envelope or be digitally transferred from the educational institution to the Registrar at **Hebrew Roots University**. ### **Homeschool Students**

**Hebrew Roots University** has a rich diversity of students who bring educational experiences from both conventional and alternative schooling. When evaluating applications for admission, **Hebrew Roots University** seeks evidence of academic preparation and proficiency.

**Hebrew Roots University** requires students to show proof that they have completed their state requirements for high school graduation. Although proof of graduation is traditionally provided through a high school transcript, **Hebrew Roots University** offers three options for homeschool students to meet this requirement:

1. **GED** (General Educational Development test): Some states require that a homeschool student take the GED. (If your state requires a GED, then you must request the GED scores be sent to **Hebrew Roots University**.)
2. **Course Transcript** (provided by an outside source): If affiliated with a homeschool program, academy, or consortium, the student should request that the outside source forward an official transcript.
3. **Academic Portfolio** (provided by a family source): If the student is affiliated with an organization that does not provide transcripts, the family will be responsible for providing a transcript as instructed below:
  - If the family has customized the program, then a detailed portfolio, including a course transcript, is required.
  - The person in charge of the homeschool program must verify the transcript as official.



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## **Dual Enrollment Program**

**Hebrew Roots University** will allow eligible high school students to take college-level courses to earn college credits. It is at the discretion of the high school to allow the student to earn both high school and college credits simultaneously for the University courses. This program allows students to get a jumpstart on higher education with classes held online.

### **Eligibility**

Students need a high school GPA of 2.0 or better at the time of registering at **Hebrew Roots University**. This program is restricted to high school **juniors and seniors**.

### **Course Options**

Students must first take the required or prerequisites courses at the Associate's or Bachelor's level.

## **Transfer of Credits**

Transferability of credits from **Hebrew Roots University** to other schools is not guaranteed and must be verified by the student directly with the target institution.

Due to the unique curriculum offered, decisions on the acceptance of transfer credits from other schools are ultimately at the discretion of **Hebrew Roots University**.

## **Policy Against Discrimination**

**Hebrew Roots University** does not discriminate based on race, color, national origin, age, sex, physical or mental handicap, marital status, or political affiliation. Any complaints related to this policy or otherwise related to discrimination may be submitted to the **Office of Records and Registration**.



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## TUITION, FEES, AND FINANCING

**Hebrew Roots University** provides affordable tuition to assist students in achieving their professional and spiritual development goals. Our programs are priced with the budget-conscious in mind.

### Methods of Payment

**Hebrew Roots University** accepts corporate benefits, private education loans, checks, or money orders.

**Hebrew Roots University** also accepts the following major credit cards: American Express, Discover, MasterCard, and Visa.

### ***Installment Payments***

Students may arrange a payment plan with the **Office of Records and Registration**.

### ***Responsibility for Payment***

Students accept responsibility for paying any and all tuition and fees in connection with their enrollment and attendance at **Hebrew Roots University** even if enrolled under a ‘special’, provisional, or matriculating (with or without conditions) status.

If students cannot pay their tuition and fees by the due date, they can arrange with **Hebrew Roots University Office of Records and Registration** to make payments under an appropriate payment plan. Subject to any other applicable policy, if for any reason admission to **Hebrew Roots University** or financial assistance is delayed or denied, the student will be held personally responsible for all tuition and fees due and owing and must pay the tuition and fees in full by the due date.

### **Suspension of Services**

**Hebrew Roots University** may prevent students from registering for any future sessions, or withhold grade reports, and other services (without limitation) if:

- Students fail to pay tuition and fees.
- Students have an account balance and have not obtained a **Hebrew Roots University** approved payment arrangement.

Transcripts, certificates, and diplomas will not be released until all balances are paid in full.

### **Refund Policy**

Students who drop or withdraw from a class within the first week of class, up to the seventh (7th) calendar day after the class starts meetings, may be eligible for a 50% refund of enrollment fees and tuition. Students who drop or withdraw from a course after 11:59 p.m. Eastern Standard Time the 7<sup>th</sup> calendar day will not be entitled to any tuition refund. Refunds are not automatic, except in cases where the University canceled the class.

Students eligible for a refund must submit a refund petition form to the **Office of Records and Registration** no later than 21 days after the start of the Term from which the student is dropping a Course or withdrawing. To drop or withdraw, students must give written notice to **Hebrew Roots University Office of Records and Registration** via facsimile or email.

The Application Fee is non-refundable once paid.

For students who are U.S. military personnel, active duty or reserve, who receive orders compelling withdrawal from courses, **Hebrew Roots University** shall, upon receipt of student orders and a petition from the student, refund the enrollment fees unless credit has already been granted.



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## STUDENT INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

### Terms and Course Credits

**Hebrew Roots University** offers two 8-week Terms during each of the Fall, Spring, and Summer Terms. The 16-week Terms are offered during the Fall, Spring, and Summer Terms. Term dates are available on the **Hebrew Roots University's** website. There is no open enrollment plan. Courses have defined start and completion dates.

Most courses at **Hebrew Roots University** are 3 or 6 credits. A student taking 12 credits during the Fall, Spring, and Summer Terms is considered a full-time student. A student taking less than 12 credits during any Term is considered a part-time student.

### Grades, Terms, and Course Credits

To maintain good academic standing, a student must demonstrate satisfactory progress toward completing his or her degree. This progress is measured by assigned grades and computed session grade point averages as well as overall grade point averages for all work completed at **Hebrew Roots University**. The official release of final grades occurs **10 business days after the end of each session**. Students requiring proof of completion of a course may request and obtain a letter from the **Office of the Registrar** verifying the course completion date.

### Grading and Academic Performance

**Hebrew Roots University** uses the following grading scale for Degree Programs:

- A = 4 grade points per semester hour
- B = 3 grade points per semester hour
- C = 2 grade points per semester hour
- D = 1 grade point per semester hour
- F = 0 grade points per semester hour
- W = Withdraw, assigned to course(s) after the add/drop period, not included in the GPA calculation
- I = Incomplete, not included in the GPA calculation

To meet graduation requirements, undergraduate students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0. Master's students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0. Doctoral students must maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0.

### **Academic Awards**

**Academic Awards** will recognize a high level of scholarship demonstrated by students in **Hebrew Roots University**. This is the **Hebrew Roots University Honor Roll**. Each Term students with GPAs above 3.0 will be recognized on the **Hebrew Roots University Honor Roll**. Students will receive a digital certificate.

### **Graduation Awards**

Students graduating (for all Degree Programs) will be honored based on their GPAs according to the schedule below.

- **Cum Laude:** 3.00 to 3.49 GPA, with distinction/honor
- **Magna Cum Laude:** 3.50 to 3.79 GPA, with great distinction/honor
- **Summa Cum Laude:** 3.80 to 4.00 GPA, with highest distinction/honor

### **Add-and-Drop Policy**

The add-and-drop period ends 7 calendar days after the start of the class session. All students are required to follow the published deadlines for registration including adding and dropping of courses. Please refer to the Refund Policy regarding fee and tuition reimbursement.

### **Withdrawal**

#### **Withdrawal from Course(s)**

Students unable to complete a course may request a withdrawal from a course after the published add/drop deadline by submitting a request in writing to the **Office of the Registrar**. Upon approval, a grade of 'W' will be assigned to the student for the course and will become a permanent part of the student's official transcript. Subject to other applicable policies or regulations, failure to participate does not constitute a drop or withdrawal from the course. To avoid academic penalties, students must take affirmative steps to timely drop or withdraw from their course(s). Students requesting to drop or withdraw will be responsible for all applicable tuition and fees.

#### **Withdrawal from Hebrew Roots University**

Students who wish to withdraw from **Hebrew Roots University** must submit a request in writing to the **Office of the Registrar**. Once the request is processed, the student will be deemed as officially withdrawn with a grade of 'W' assigned for any course(s) in an ongoing session. Students requesting to withdraw will be responsible for all applicable tuition and fees. Subject to

other applicable policies or regulations, failure to participate does not constitute a withdrawal from **Hebrew Roots University**.

### **Academic Integrity**

**Hebrew Roots University** regards academic integrity as vital to the success of its students and the reputation of the University as an institution of higher learning. Students attain their educational goals and enjoy an enriched academic experience only when there is effective learning. Effective learning occurs when students conduct their own research and are the sole authors of their work. The assessment of that learning is undermined when the originality of students' work is questionable. **Hebrew Roots University**, therefore, expects students to adhere to the highest standards of academic integrity in all of their work.

### **Plagiarism**

The most common form of academic dishonesty is the presentation of the work of another person as one's own and is referred to as "plagiarism". Plagiarism is a serious academic infraction that tarnishes everyone associated with it. Civil and criminal penalties may also apply where conduct violates U.S. copyright laws. Also, students violating this policy by failing to submit original work may be subject to loss of eligibility for tuition assistance or financial aid including cancellation of awards and disbursements of aid.

In addition to the most common form, plagiarism includes, but is not limited to:

- **Contract Cheating:** Hiring another person or organization to prepare and/or complete academic work on your behalf
- **Copy and Paste:** Piecing together the work of other people, section by section or as a whole, and presenting such copied work as your own
- **Direct Duplication:** Manual or electronic copying of the work of another person, including from an article, website, book, online repository, or another student and presenting such copied work as your own
- **Paraphrasing:** Restating another person's work with minor changes but maintaining the essence or meaning of the statement without properly citing the source
- **Submitting or Facilitating the Submission of Prior Work:** Submitting work previously submitted for assessment whether created by oneself or another student
- **Using Artificial Intelligence (AI)** generated writing, or designs are not appropriate to use at **Hebrew Roots University**. AI language models can be used to generate ideas and provide inspiration but not used in place of one's own original thinking and writing. When presenting someone else's work, it is necessary to give credit to the source, otherwise it is plagiarism.

Facilitating academic dishonesty is also a violation of **Hebrew Roots University's** Academic Integrity policy. It includes but is not limited to:

- Intentionally assisting another student to commit an act of academic dishonesty
  - Attempting to assist another student to commit an act of academic dishonesty
- While facilitating academic dishonesty may not directly benefit the facilitator, it does assist another student in violation of the policy.

### **To Avoid Plagiarism**

- Never represent the work of another person as your own. Use your own words in referring to the ideas or concepts of others, even when collaborating with other students.
- When you do use the idea of another person, give credit to the author/source. For example, you may state: “Another point of view, as espoused by Smith (2000), is that...”
- Use quotation marks for material (up to about 40 words in length) written by another person and properly cite the source.
- Separate material (consisting of 40 or more words) written by another person by indenting a half inch, using no quotation marks, and properly citing the source.
- You are responsible for familiarizing yourself with the course guidelines and the elements of a well-written paper. For questions or concerns regarding plagiarism, you are urged to contact your Instructor.

### **Procedure for Reporting and Resolving Charges of Plagiarism**

Charges of plagiarism may be raised by anyone including but not limited to:

- Faculty
- Administrators and Staff
- Other Students

The following procedures apply when a student is suspected of plagiarism:

- The relevant details shall first be presented to the Course Instructor.
- If the charge is deemed credible, the Instructor shall contact the student and request an explanation.
- After communicating with the student, the Instructor may do any one or more of the following:
  - Accept the student’s explanation and deem the matter closed.
  - Direct the student to resubmit the assignment(s) in question.
  - Assign a failing grade for the assignment(s) in question.
  - Assign an appropriate final grade in the course.
  - Impose any other appropriate educational/academic sanction.
  - Refer the matter to the **Office of Academic Affairs** for appropriate sanctions including but not limited to suspension and expulsion from the University.

- A student may not avoid an academic integrity allegation or assigned sanction by dropping or withdrawing from a course.
- Students seeking financial aid will not satisfy the disbursement requirements by submitting plagiarized assignments.
- **Hebrew Roots University** reserves the right to review all current and previous coursework (whether graded or ungraded; whether by a current student or graduate) of any student found to have engaged in plagiarism. Where plagiarism by a current student in prior coursework is confirmed, appropriate sanctions may be applied including but not limited to expulsion. Where plagiarism by a graduate is confirmed, appropriate sanctions may include revocation of the degree awarded.

### **Right of Appeal**

In cases where a penalty/sanction is applied, the student shall have the right of appeal as follows:

- Any decision rendered by an Instructor may be appealed to the **Office of Academic Affairs** within five business days of the decision.
- Any decision rendered by the **Office of Academic Affairs** may be appealed to the **Office of the Chancellor** within five business days of the decision.
- Where appropriate, the **Office of the Chancellor** may schedule a hearing to inform the student of recommended sanctions and afford the student an opportunity to formally respond to the allegations and provide supporting evidence or documentation.
- In all cases, the decision of the **Office of the Chancellor** shall be final and not subject to any further appeals or other proceedings.

## **Student Services**

### **Admissions**

- The Registrar supports prospective students by answering questions, providing information, and assisting with the initial application process.
- During the admissions process, the Registrar engages with students on their educational and professional goals to ensure that all students are in a program that best meets their needs.
- Each student also has an **Academic Interview** via Zoom with the Vice President of Academic Affairs before they begin classes at the University. The Interview provides an opportunity for students to meet faculty before classes start and identify areas where the student may need support to ensure their academic success.

### **Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. Under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), students also have the right to:

- Inspect and review their education records
- Seek amendment of inaccurate or misleading information in their education records
- Consent to most disclosures of personally identifiable information from education records

Requests regarding education records must be directed to the Office of the Registrar. In compliance with FERPA, **Hebrew Roots University** will require written permission from students in order to release any information from a student's education record. However, FERPA allows schools to disclose those records, without consent, to the following parties or under the following conditions (34 CFR § 99. 31):

- School officials with legitimate educational interest
  - **Hebrew Roots University** considers school officials to include faculty members, administrators, board members, advisors, support or clerical staff, and information technology staff, as well as any contractor, consultant, volunteer, or other parties to whom the university has outsourced institutional services or functions including research studies.
  - **Hebrew Roots University** considers a school official to have a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record to fulfill his or her professional responsibility.
- Other schools to which a student is transferring
- Specified officials for audit or evaluation purposes
- Appropriate parties in connection with financial aid to a student
- Organizations conducting certain studies for or on behalf of the school
- Accrediting organizations
- To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena
- Under certain circumstances, **Hebrew Roots University** will make a reasonable effort to notify the student of an order or subpoena in advance of compliance, so that the student may seek protective action.
- Appropriate officials in cases of health and safety emergencies
- State and local authorities within a juvenile justice system pursuant to specific state law.

### **Student Consent and Release**

As part of ongoing efforts to promote and establish **Hebrew Roots University**, students are asked to sign a consent and release during the initial application and enrollment process. By signing this consent form, students give **Hebrew Roots University** and **Arthur Bailey Ministries International** permission to use their likeness, image and statements regarding **Hebrew Roots University** for marketing and promotional purposes.

## COMPLAINT AND GRIEVANCE RESOLUTION

It is the philosophy and practice of **Hebrew Roots University** that grievances be addressed in a non-adversarial climate. When grievances cannot be resolved informally, students have available to them a number of mechanisms, as outlined in this **Student Policy Handbook**, for seeking redress. Students may contact the **Office of Records and Registration** for assistance and guidance.

### Communications

It is **Hebrew Roots University** policy that students, faculty, and staff maintain respectful, professional, and polite conduct in all communications at all times, including telephonic and email. The speed at which email can be sent is not always conducive to this level of professionalism. When people are upset or angry, they often send sarcastic and unpleasant emails in an attempt to vent their frustration. These types of emails are not acceptable. This should be considered before communicating via email.

All students, faculty, and staff are expected to treat one another with respect. Negative emotions have no place in any communication directed to any member of **Hebrew Roots University**. When upset for any reason, **Hebrew Roots University** members are encouraged to wait until they are less upset before sending any email or other communication. Information about proper “netiquette” may be found on the Internet.

Any student, faculty, or staff sending an irate, sarcastic, rude, harassing, disrespectful, or unprofessional email or other communication to another member of **Hebrew Roots University** will be subject to disciplinary action. Violations of this policy will be subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal from **Hebrew Roots University**.

### Students with Disabilities

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, subsequent amendments, and other applicable regulations protect qualified individuals from discrimination based on their disabilities.

Individuals with disabilities are defined as persons with a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. People who have a record of or who are registered as having a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities are also covered. Major life activities include caring for oneself, walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, working, performing manual tasks, and learning. Temporary conditions lasting less than six months are not considered a disability.



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It is the policy of **Hebrew Roots University** not to deny any qualified individual with a disability access to or participation in any aspects of educational activities and services. All inquiries, requests, claims, or complaints by students or prospective students must be directed to the **Office of Records and Registration** following the procedures for verifying the disability and requesting accommodations.

**Passover:** Evening of the 14<sup>th</sup> Day of the First Biblical Month of Aviv or Abib (Gregorian Calendar March/April)

**Unleavened Bread:** 15<sup>th</sup> day of the First Biblical Month of Aviv or Abib (Gregorian Calendar March/April)

**Pentecost/ Feast of Weeks/ Shavuot:** 50<sup>th</sup> Day from the weekly Sabbath within the Feast of Unleavened Bread; (Gregorian Calendar May/June)

**Day of Trumpets:** 1<sup>st</sup> Day of the 7<sup>th</sup> Biblical Month (Gregorian Calendar August/September)

**Day of Atonement:** 10<sup>th</sup> Day of the 7<sup>th</sup> Biblical Month (Gregorian Calendar August/September)

**Feast of Tabernacles:** 15<sup>th</sup> Day of the 7<sup>th</sup> Biblical Month (Gregorian Calendar September/October)

**The Eighth Day:** 22<sup>nd</sup> Day of the 7<sup>th</sup> Month (Gregorian Calendar September/October)
